Clinicians are responsible for intake assessment, treatment planning, and implementation of adventure therapy sessions, in accordance with individual client needs. Core Competencies:

- 1. Master's or Doctoral Degree in a Mental Health related area.
- 2. State of Illinois Licensure preferred or in progress to take test for first tier licensure: MFT, LSW, LPC, (or in progress of collecting hours for) as a LCPC, LMFT, LCSW, PHD, or PsyD
- 3. Trauma informed skills and therapeutic practices
- 4. Commitment to Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging
- 5. Ability to build meaningful relationships with clients, clients' families, AW team members, collaborators, and partners.
- 6. Solid understanding of youth development; Ability to evaluate special circumstances or ethics of youth/family work
- 7. Experience and confidence identifying and assessing treatment supported by evidence.
- 8. Passion to work with children and families (or a willingness to grow this passion)
- 9. Competence in mindfulness, grounding practices, adventure therapy and related modalities (or willingness to learn)
- 10. Ability to work flexible hours, including evenings and occasional Saturdays
- 11. Strong organizational/time management skills
- 12. Strong written and verbal communication skills

- 13. Proficiency with a computer and basic software including the Google Suite
- 14. Willingness to adopt, promote, and improve on AW's mission and agency culture
- 15. Work through a multiculturally sensitive and trauma sensitive lens
- 16. Physically capable of performing adventure based activities and lifting up to 50 lbs unassisted or with reasonable accommodations

Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Design adventure therapy plans for groups and individual sessions that utilize the golden thread and best practices in treatment planning.
- 2. Perform assessments and intakes of new clients; Diagnose mental health disorders and plan treatment
- 3. Complete thorough documentation, timely notes and tracking outcomes to drive treatment.
- 4. Self-directed to manage time and tasks effectively.
- 5. Consult with ancillary treatment providers, schools and other agencies as needed.
- 6. Willingness to learn best practices and deliver experiential, adventure-based interventions.
- 7. Maintain continuing education credits according to professional licensing requirements.
- 8. Engage in creative processing with group facilitators; flexible, open to feedback and change.
- 9. Utilize and participate in individual and group supervision, according to licensing requirements and experience.
- 10. Consider oneself an ambassador for Adventure Works; represent agency in the community
- 11. Willingness to be outdoors in all weather conditions; plan interventions for outdoor activities with inclement weather indoor backup plans.
- 12. Engage in regular professional development including Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, conflict resolution, team building, practical interventions, and experiential learning with the team to embody the work you facilitate.
- 13. Communicate effectively with staff, supervisors, clients, families and community partners through email, phone and in person.
